## HISTORY OF LAKESIDE

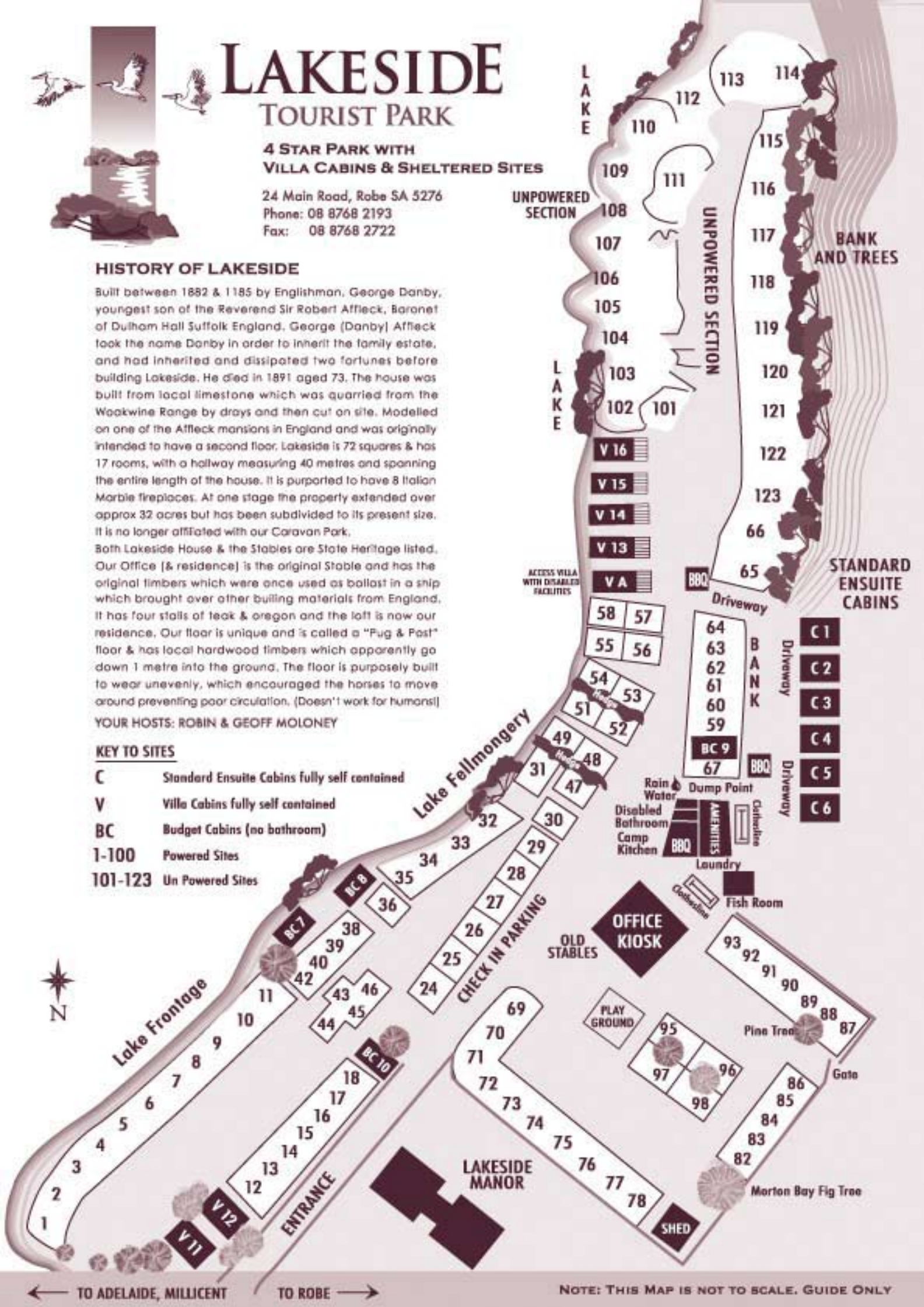
Built between 1882 & 1885 by Englishman, George Danby, youngest son of the Reverend Sir Robert Affleck, Baronet of Dulham Hall Suffolk England. George (Danby) Affleck took the name Danby in order to inherit the family estate, and had inherited and dissipated two fortunes before building Lakeside. He died in 1891 aged 73. The house was built from local limestone which was quarried from the Waukwinne Range by drays and then cut on site. Modelled on one of the Affleck mansions in England and was originally intended to have a second floor. Lakeside is 72 squares & has 17 rooms, with a hallway measuring 40 metres and spanning the entire length of the house. It is purported to have 8 Italian Marble fireplaces. At one stage the property extended over approx 32 acres but has been subdivided to its present size. It is no longer affiliated with our Caravan Park.

Both Lakeside House & the Stables are State Heritage listed. Our Office (& residence) is the original Stable and has the original timbers which were once used as ballast in a ship which brought over other building materials from England. It has four stalls of teak & oregon and the loft is now our residence. Our floor is unique and is called a "Pug & Post" floor & has local hardwood timbers which apparently go down 1 metre into the ground. The floor is purposely built to wear unevenly, which encouraged the horses to move around preventing poor circulation. (Doesn't work for humans!)
